A new virtual Flow Country helps to inspire people about the Peatlands

The Flows to the Future Project led a well attended event on Saturday 25 June at Caithness Horizons, celebrating the launch of the new digital resources that have been recently created as part of the Heritage Lottery Funded project.

Both children and adults enjoyed exploring the peatland landscape by testing their conservation skills and battling for the highest score in the carbon capture game, discovering the sights and sounds of the peatlands through the 3D landscape model or by watching the new 'The Flow Country' film produced by award winning film makers Maramedia.

For both the 3D landscape model and computer game it was the first time they had been seen by the public and provided an excellent opportunity to test them out. Feedback from the day was fantastic; people felt they were a great way to find out more about the Flow Country in a fun and engaging way and looked forward to exploring them in more detail at home. Dr Roxane Anderson, Peatland Scientist from the Environmental Research Institute in Thurso attended the event and said: "I was delighted to attend the event and see the positive response from the public to the film, the 3D model and the game. The model really brings the Flows to life "virtually" and will be invaluable in raising awareness of this amazing landscape in the UK and even around the world. The game proved very popular with the kids, and I hope it can be used in schools to help them understand how we can have a huge and long-lasting impact on the peatlands, the species that inhabit them but also for our own quality of life by making better management choices."
