## Flows to the Future project to host a Tourism Familiarisation Event

Tourism businesses are invited to learn the What, Where, When and Why for tourists visiting the Flow Country peatlands in North Scotland

The Flows to the Future project is offering tourism businesses the opportunity to discover more about the project and how they hope to engage with visitors over the coming season. They will host a familiarisation event about the Flow Country peatlands on 12 April 2016.

It gives a great impression of the beautiful landscapes and everything that happens here! The event gives an overview of the fantastic peatland landscapes through a multimedia presentation and talks. After the buffet lunch participants can take part in a guided visit to the RSPB Forsinard Flows National Nature Reserve where they will have the opportunity to visit the new Flows Lookout Tower on the Dubh Lochan Trail as well as the RSPB Visitor Centre. They will meet the staff behind the Flows Project and the RSPB reserve and discover how staff and volunteers are working to promote the wildlife and landscape of the Flow Country to local communities and to a broad range of visitors.
